How to get the most out of the NHS: Pharmacy First

Every week appointment with your GP are taken to discuss minor conditions. Advice and treatment for these problems can be got at your local pharmacy.

Freeing up appointments about warts, athletes foot and colds would allow your GP to spend more time tackling complex and challenging problems.

If you are suffering from one of the ailments listed across, you may not need to go to your GP for treatment. So, instead of waiting for a GP's appointment, visit your local community pharmacy first.

No appointment is necessary. The pharmacist will always offer advice and if appropriate they will supply a medicine from their formulary.

If the pharmacist considers supply of a medicine is appropriate then it will be free for patients who are eligible for free prescription (you will need to show proof of exemption).

Patients who have to pay for prescriptions will pay the current prescription charge. If the medicine costs less than the prescription charge, then the patient would be informed of this so they can purchase it instead. Happy New Year to all our Patients! Minor surgery & Joint Injections

At Little Horton lane experienced Primary Care Surgeons offer a streamlined Minor Surgery Service. We accept referrals from other practices. Waiting times are short and we provide a largely one-stop service.

Our complication rates are very low and our patient satisfaction very high.

The Minor Surgery & Joint Injections Clinic is run by: Dr Al– Hity and Senior Health Care Assistant.

Procedures covered by the Minor Surgery Clinic:

- Benign lesion excision including those on the face eg cysts, lipomas
- Aspiration and injection of ganglion
- Hand injections Other injections shoulder joint, knee joint, bursitis
- Steroid injection of keloid scar
- Ingrown toenail excision/ablation
- Circumcision

Dermatology

Referrals welcomed by the Dermatology Clinic:

- Psoriasis except if second line treatments are anticipated PUVA, UVB or oral medication
- Eczema Atopic, Seborrhoeic, Contract (allergy/irritant) Asteatotic and Discoid
- Diagnostic dilemmas other rashes
- Severe acne including those for Isotretinoin
- Rosacea
- Precancerous skin conditions
- Disorders of pigmentation
- Disorders of hair/nails
- Urticaria
- Blistering disorders
- Benign tumours/diagnostic uncertainty

Well Women Clinic

The well woman clinic is run by our highly trained, experienced doctor who has under-taken additional training in smears, swabs, and contraceptive procedures. The clinic is currently running every Fortnight on Thursday afternoon on an appointment basis.

Smears are routinely carried out every 3 years for ages 24-49yrs and every 5 years for 50 to 64yrs wit the practice nurse. Other appointments are available on other days if needed for smears.

Home Visits

Home visits are strictly for people too ill to get to the surgery or for

housebound patients. If you require a home visit please telephone reception before 10am if possible. A doctor may phone you back as it may be that your problem can be dealt with by telephone advice. Please remember that several patients can be seen in the practice in the time that it takes to make one home visit. There are also better facilities for examining and treating patients at the Surgery.

Stop Smoking Advice

The surgery has a dedicated stop smoking advisor who is available to help and advise you on ways to quit smoking and improve your health. Many aids and products are avail-able such as medication, patches and gum. Please speak with

reception to make an appointment.
